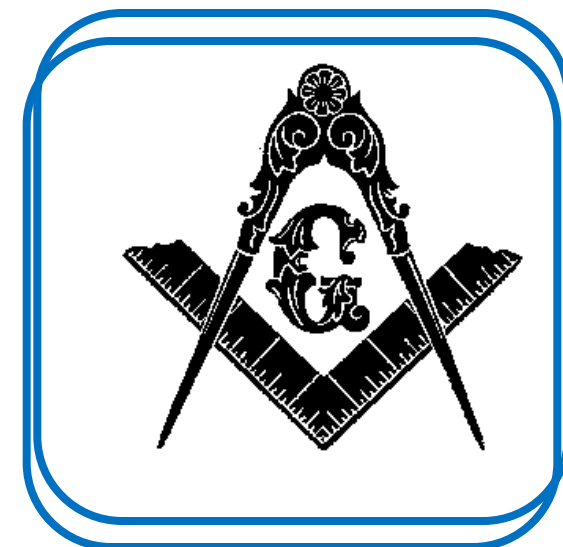

Brethren,
