

Charles Edward Crask

Was born on February 7, 1930 in Trinidad, Colorado to Dorothy Lee & Herbert Gilbert Crask. He graduated from Trinidad High in 1948. He joined the Navy in 1949 and served for 3 years. After completing basic training in San Diego he was stationed in Guam. From Guam he joined the crew of the USS Gregory, a destroyer, as an electricians mate. On the Gregory he spent time in Korea. After 3 years Charles returned to Trinidad where he joined the family sheet metal business.

On January 4, 1953 Charles married Dorothy Lea Waldroup. They spent the next 62 years together and every day Dorothy would say “I love you” and Charles would respond “I love you more”.

On June 17 of 1954 they welcomed their 1st child, Thomas Edward. Two years later on August 5, 1956 the family grew with the addition of Randall Lee, and on January 7, 1960 their family was complete with the addition of Susan Lynn.

In 1968 the family moved to Boulder and then in 1970 to Arvada. Charles went to work at Rocky Flats. After several years he left Rocky Flats and went to work for Climax Metal Fab. In 1978 he bought Suburban Hardware. In 1980 Randy joined him in the business and they began working in the mountains near Breckenridge and Vail. Charles & Randy opened High Country Sheet Metal in 1981 where they lived and worked until 1991.

In the early 80's Charles had his first heart attack and 6 years later he had his 2nd, following back surgery. Charles endured everything from crushing his heel, severing his finger, bloody noses which once resulted in several yards of gauze being put up his nose, a knee replacement and several falls from ladders. The most serious occurring in 2012 which resulted in a broken hip and a shredded rotator cuff. Through every injury Charles maintained his sense of humor.

After selling the business in Vail in 1991 and returning to Denver, Charles went to work selling rubberized asphalt. He retired in 1992 at age 62 and spent the next 23 years working around the house, spending time attending his grandchildren's football, baseball, soccer games, swim meets, band & choir concerts and whatever other activity they got up to. He and Dorothy were active in 4 wheelers and Friends of Historic Trinidad. Charles was also a Mason. In his later years he took up making beautiful works of stained glass and gifted all his family with his works of art.

Remembrances of Charles Crask:
I first met Dad Charlie Crask a little more than 45 years ago, when his son transferred into Arvada DeMolay from Boulder Chapter.
For a long time, I didn't know what to think of this occasionally stubborn, frequently stoic man. Woe be to the DeMolay boy who did something that was not well thought out. We'd usually get a withering look that would make us stop in our tracks, and rethink what we'd just done. Then the corner of his mouth would turn up, in just a wee little smile. If he liked you, he'd say: "That wasn't the smartest thing I've ever seen. Did you learn something?" As the years went by, I must have done a few things right by him, because it was Dad Crask who nominated me for my Chevalier Degree. It's nice to know that he changed from the Advisor who frequently put the fear of the almighty in me, to being one of my biggest supporters. However, it wasn't just me; Dad Crask was a supporter of ALL of his DeMolay Boys; from the time that Randy and I were active, until his own Grandson, Nathaniel, went through the chairs in DeMolay.

Charles was a skilled craftsman both within and without the Masonic Lodge. He frequently referred to himself as 'just a tinner', but he could take a pile of parts and raw materials and shape them into an amazingly cohesive and complex HVAC system. He cut, shaped, bent, and assembled ductwork systems into some of the most amazing places in Colorado. As a Past Master of his lodge, and as a Youth Group Advisor, he shaped, and occasionally bent, people into good citizens, and frequently good leaders.
I was, and still am, honored to be accepted as a part of the extended Crask family. Charles Crask, you will be missed for a long time, by many generations of those you have touched with your kindness, your gentle spirit, and your good humor.


cherished. I sorry to have to forego his services on Saturday. Please extend my condolences to Randy and Nathan and the rest of the Crask family.
